Nefertiti Lift

Named after the Egyptian queen famed for perfect neck and jawline beauty. Botulinum toxin is delivered into the platysma bands in neck, preventing the downward pull on the jawline.

Mesotox Facial

A bespoke blend of Botulinum toxin and amino acids delivered to the skin via a device housing 24 carat gold plated needles. A painless procedure, providing superb results and producing a flawless airbrushed look to the skin. Recommended quarterly.

Masseter

To reduce teeth grinding, jaw clenching, jaw line slimming and facial contouring.

Botox injections help to stop, or greatly reduce the symptoms of excessive sweating. This usually takes place within 2 weeks of treatment with the effects lasting between 6 to 7 months.

Botulinum Toxin

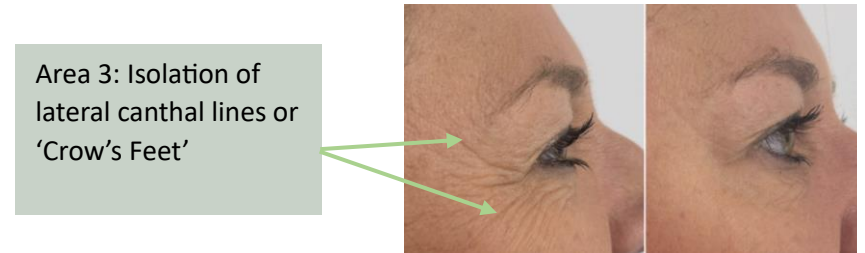
Botulinum toxin is a naturally occurring compound. It is used in aesthetics to prevent muscles responding to nerve impulses. Facial expressions such as frowning, create forehead lines caused by contraction of the underlying muscle.

Small doses of Botulinum toxin administered to facial muscles lead to their isolation and subsequent inability to contract, effectively smoothing the skin. You will not see a change straight away, the effects of Botulinum toxin take several days to achieve optimal results, they are however temporary, and from 6 weeks post-procedure, movement will begin to return, although the procedural effects will last approximately 3 to 6 months.



Area 1: Isolation of the frontalis muscle to relax forehead lines.

Area 2: Glabellar region or 'Frown' Lines



Area 3: Isolation of lateral canthal lines or 'Crow's Feet'



Isolation of the frontalis muscle. This muscle is stronger in men (and some women) so the dosage is increased to achieve the desired effect.

Mesotox facial: the 'after' image is 3 days post-procedure.



What to expect

During the procedure: Firstly, your practitioner will remove any makeup, they will then mark out the areas to be treated and prepare the dosage required. This will have been agreed at your consultation. The procedure uses an extremely fine needle to reduce discomfort and in many cases is virtually pain free.

Immediately after the procedure: You will probably see some small bumps where the botulinum toxin was injected, and perhaps some slight bruising. The bumps will subside in 20 to 30 minutes but it's important NOT to massage these as it can cause the neurotoxin to spread into adjacent muscles. Before you leave the clinic, your practitioner will arrange your 2-week review.

The days after the procedure: There is virtually no downtime associated with anti-wrinkle treatments. Some clients report headaches and occasionally flu-like symptoms, but these are nothing to worry about, and can be treated with proprietary pain killers.

Treatments should be scheduled no less than 12 weeks apart; otherwise, you are at risk of building a resistance to the botulinum toxin. As this is a prescription-only medication, it cannot be prescribed within these limits. Once botulinum toxin wears off, your muscles will function as they did before treatment, this means the wrinkles that you had smoothed, will slowly begin to appear again. No new wrinkles have resulted due to treatment.

Pre-Treatment Advice

Before your appointment: Alcohol, aspirin, and anti-inflammatories such as ibuprofen, all increase the blood clotting time. To reduce bruising and bleeding, it is important to avoid these in the days before your procedure. If you develop a skin infection in the treatment area, you will have to wait for it to subside before your next appointment.
